


We have included these **assessment codes** to aid understanding of what a level looks like in Art and Design for both learners, and Parents / Carers. **Developing, effective and highly effective** denotes where the learner is within this level when assessed on an individual piece of work. If you wish to discuss levels further please speak to the Art and Design Teacher during parent contact opportunities such as Parent / Carers Evenings or writing in your child's contact book.

Line Drawing of 3 Different Objects from Your Pencil Case

focus- line, proportions, form, perspective

Task: using **line**, and **weight of line**, draw 3 objects from your pencil case. Overlap them to create an interesting group of 3.

Line weight describes the thickness or thinness of a line. It can be used to give a feeling of depth. **Thin line** = light edges. **Thick line** = edges in shade.

Tonal Gradient

Task: create a tonal gradient like the one below. By slowly increasing the pressure of your pencil (pressure = how heavy you use pencil) move from light tone > mid tone > dark tone > dark.

Tone means how light or dark something is. The tones artists and designers use and the contrast between them can create very different moods and visual effects in artwork.


tonal gradient – highlight, light tone, mid tone, dark tone, dark



The first box should have no shading as this is the 'highlight', the last box is the darkest tone in the range.

Observational Drawing – Symmetry and Tone

focus: line, shape, tone, form, pattern, texture and symmetry

Task: draw the other half of the tiger's face in line. Try and achieve symmetry. Complete the drawing using tone. Use your completed tonal gradient to help you.




3D Form – Sphere (ball)

Task: Use a tonal range similar to the picture with a 2B pencil to create a sphere (ball).

key words describing tone

- highlight
- light tone
- mid tone
- dark tone
- dark

The light on your sphere (ball) should be coming from the same direction as the example.



Observational drawing of an apple. Directional pencil work.

focus - tone, highlights, form and cast shadow

Task: using the above focus points and **line**, **shape** and **colour** create a pencil drawing of an apple. Only draw from a real apple or a photographic image. You <u>must not</u> create a drawing of someone else's drawing.







Challenge: create a composition demonstrating how one object is in front (in the foreground) and one is behind (in the background)

Learner choice: Put one apple in front of another and draw.

or

Put an apple in front of another object of your choice and draw.

Tonal study of a wrapped sweet



Task: using the above focus points and **line**, **shape** and **tone** create a drawing of a wrapped sweet.





Coloured pencil study of a cupcake

focus - scale, form/3D shape, blended colour, tone, texture

Task: only draw from a real cupcake or a photographic image. You <u>must</u> not create a drawing of someone else's drawing. Complete your drawing using coloured pencil and the visual elements of **line**, **shape**, **tone**, **form**, **colour**, **texture**, **pattern**.




Colour Studies of Fruit / Vegetables

focus - colour blending, tone, form and colour in the shadow underneath

Task instructions

- lightly draw out the shape from a real piece of fruit / veg
- build up the lightest colour and tone following the form with directional marks
- build and blend colour/ tone gradually use the diagram below as a guide
- the shadow underneath should be made up of blended colour rather than being black or grey




Tonal study of an Eye

focus – line, shape, tone and texture

Task: Use a range of tones to show the different surfaces, textures and details of the whole eye area. For example, the reflective surface of the eye compared to the texture of the eyebrow. Use a mirror to draw your own eye or draw a friend's eye or use a photograph of an eye. You <u>must not</u> create a drawing of someone else's drawing.

Design – pattern development

focus – line, shape, pattern and texture


Task: Use a range of pattern to create a t-shirt design. Create the pattern in pencil first, then go over your pencil design with your fine-liner pen. To be successful, vary the weight of line and fill some shapes. You can choose to add colour or not.



Design and Creativity Challenge – create a mythical creature. Pupil Voice.

Task: Choose 2 animals to create a new mythical creature. The 2 animals you choose will be very different so you will have to be creative to figure out how they will fit together. This is an observational drawing task - use books, magazines or the internet for your source images of your 2 animals. You can choose to use colour or not.





You must also give your mythical creature a name using parts of the original

animals' names.

e.g. this is a LADYPUG




