



Tonal Drawing of Knotted Fabric

Tone is used to show the effect of light on surfaces or objects.

Task: knot a pillow case or tea towel. Using **line** and **tone** draw knotted fabric.




tonal gradient – highlight, light tone, mid tone, dark tone, dark

Observation Drawing of Shoes

Tone is used to show the effect of light on surfaces or objects.

- contrasting tones create depth and 3D shape or form
- focus scale, shape, form (3D), perspective, tone, ellipses, pattern, texture

Task: set up a shoe or trainer. Using line and tone draw the shoe and cast shadow.







Understanding ellipses and 3D form of cylinders (using tone)



Tone is used to show the effect of light on surfaces or objects. Contrasting tones create depth and 3D shape or form




3D Form - Sphere, Cone, Cylinder

Task: draw a sphere, cone and cylinder using tone.

To create 3D forms you need to:

1. Do a line drawing first using proportions, measuring, ellipses, perspective and lines of symmetry.

2. Apply a range of contrasting tone to create form and depth by showing light, medium and dark tones for shadows and highlights.



Tonal study of a cup of tea or coffee and a biscuit in a small compositional arrangement

focus - scale, shape, form (3d), perspective, tone, ellipses, pattern, texture

Task: using the above focus point and **line**, **shape** and **tone** create a drawing of a small compositional arrangement of some biscuits and a cup from your home.

Pen and Ink Tonal Practice Sheet


Use the different techniques; hatching, cross-hatching and stippling to create tone going from the lightest to the darkest using your **fine-liner pen**.

Hatching – draw strokes in the same direction.

Crosshatching draw strokes in 2 different directions.

Stippling – using dots of ink

TIP: the closer you space your lines or dots, the darker the tone becomes.



Hatching

Draw strokes in the same direction and layer them to produce darker shades.



Crosshatching

Similar to hatching, crosshatching uses layered strokes to build shades. Draw the strokes in two different directions to create this effect.









Stippling is made with dots. The closer the dots are together the darker the tone.

Coloured pencil study of a flower of your choice

focus - scale, form/ 3D shape, blended colour, tone, texture, perspective.

Task: draw from a real flower or a photographic image only. Use coloured pencils and the visual elements of line, shape, tone, form, colour, texture, pattern.




Colour Studies of Fruit / Vegetables

focus - colour blending, tone, form and colour in the shadow underneath

Task instructions

- lightly draw out the shape from a real piece of fruit / veg
- build up the lightest colour and tone following the form with directional marks
- build and blend colour/ tone gradually use the diagram below as a guide
- the shadow underneath should be made up of blended colour rather than being black or grey




Selective composition - enlarging

Focus – line, shape, form, tone, pattern, texture, composition arrangement

Task instructions

- Divide your page into 6 sections
- Create close-up observations of a section of a key using line, shape and tone.
- Important no box should show the whole key.

Focus: tone, colour, form, perspective, texture



Colour Study of Sweets

Task: this is a super challenge task

- empty a packet of sweets on a surface. Dolly mixtures are best as they have a variety of shapes and lines
- draw out in line first, you should be drawing them more than double the size
- then add colour, tone and texture using coloured pencil.







Study of a Nose and Mouth

- build and blend tone gradually use the diagrams below as a guide








Create a Pattern Square

focus: line, shape, pattern


Task Instructions:


- using boxes 1 6 logically plan each stage of how to create your pattern square.

Observational Drawing - Stylising and Simplifying for Design Development

Task: complete a tonal study of an object, or even use one of the tonal drawings you completed earlier from this booklet. Now create 3 stages of stylising and simplifying your drawing for design using similar approaches to below. You should have 4 drawings.

- **1.** Realistic tonal drawing of a bird
- 2. Simplified, line illustration of a bird
- 3. Stylised, 3 colour selection drawing of a bird
- **4.** Stylised, simplified, positive and negative drawing of a bird, suitable for logo creation

Design Challenge – font development.

Digital or hand drawn

Task:

Design Brief – experiment with font development to create a look for an independent record label.

- pick your own name for the record label.
- decide on what type of music they publish...pop, rock, hiphop, country, classical...to inspire your design
- set out your experiments of font style, development and shape on a page. You can create your fonts by hand or by using digital skills if you have access to these at home. Alternatively go to a local library, use their computers and then email / download your design

Media, Techniques and Composition


Your studies in \$1-\$3 in Art and Design should have given you experience in many media handling techniques. In all cases consider using different colours of paper - don't just use white paper.

You should consider showing a wide range of visual elements - colour, line, tone, shape, form, pattern, texture, etc. and also use a variety of scale in your work with some close up/zoom in studies.

Below, are ideas for media and technique:

- Continuous line drawing perhaps with fine-liner pen.
- Pen and wash draw an object, add tone, then carefully add water to blend.
- Ballpoint pen use a pen, adding tone by cross hatching to create a bold image.
- Watercolour paints to show delicate transparent finishes.
- Poster paints blended or built up with dots in pointillism technique.
- Acrylic paints to show thick, impasto style techniques.
- Printmaking you could use polystyrene to make a mono print or a layered print.
- Oil pastels you could use a dotted pointillism technique or small linear marks, or a blended technique. You could use a cocktail stick to scrape to add finer detail.
- Chalk pastels carefully blended to create subtle effects.
- Charcoal on toned paper used to create strong tonal images. Use a rubber and white chalk to add highlights.
- Coloured pencils build up tones gradually and evenly to show control / suggest form.
- Paper batik use chalk to draw an image, paint between with thick paint, then add waterproof ink and wash off.
- Collage perhaps making tonal studies using a variety of papers.
- Mixed media add more interest to a painting by adding pencil or pen detail.
- Texture in your work consider adding tissue paper, sand, or PVA glue.


