


OOH...CAKES

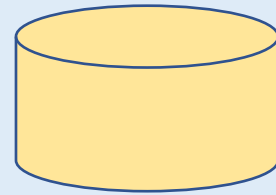
Please look at the images of different cakes that I have provided.


Choose one of these to draw or find a photograph on the internet of a similar quality.

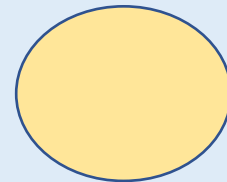
You must not make up a cake from your imagination, you are practising **observational drawing**.


Draw the simple shape of your cake lightly with a pencil. Every cake is individual in its shape and form.

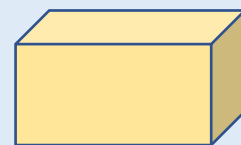
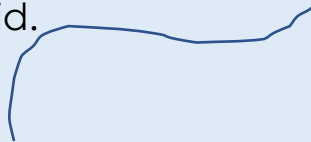
 **cupcake** – it is made up of ellipses (squashed circles), curves and straight lines. The basic form is a cylinder.




 **doughnut** – it is made up of ellipses of varying sizes. The basic form is a sphere.



 **finger bun** – it is made up of curved and diagonal lines. The basic form is a cuboid.



 Look back at the edges of your cake. Are they uneven? Are they crinkled? Draw more detail. Look at the direction of the swirls of cream or curves of the sauce.

If you only have pencil, please create a tonal drawing of your chosen cake.



If you have coloured pencils please add colour once you have drawn your chosen cake

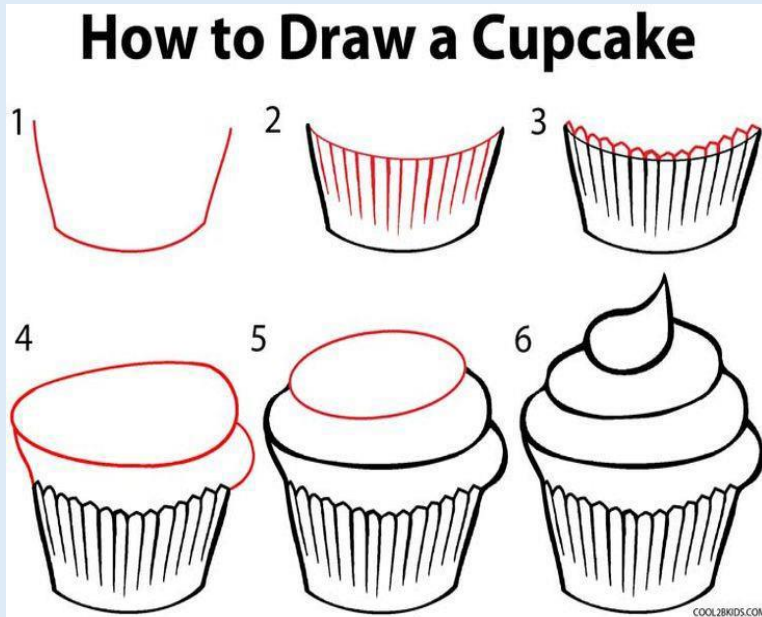
