Treasure Hunt

Just like the Pirates of the Caribbean, Create a treasure hunt for someone to complete with clues that will lead them around the garden/house and then to a final destination OR you could create a treasure map of your house with a trail to follow and an 'X' marking the spot.



Camp Fire

Taking you back to cooking like the cavemen, I would like you to plan and help prepare a family meal that you can cook in one pot. If you are able to you can cook the meal over an open fire. If not cooking on the hob in the house is fine. Once you have eaten all that some marshmallows over the fire would be a nice treat.



Build a Fort

Everyone loves building a fort. You can build one using cushions, blankets, duvets, sheets or other items from outside. Your fantasy fort can be a fairy house, blanket fort, cushion castle or a tepee. This challenge will help you build construction and engineering skills.



Blindfolded Obstacle Course

Create an obstacle course in your house or garden using different objects. Try it out yourself to make sure it's not too easy or difficult. Then get someone in your house to complete it blindfolded. You will need to be their guide and tell them where to go when they can't see.



Set up a Tent

Try setting up an outdoor tent with an adult if you have one in the house. This will require lots of problem solving skills. If you don't have a tent at home you can design one with these criteria: it sleeps four people, has a dining area and toilet area. You could do this on paper, the computer or even make a model.



Camp fire songs

Sing your favourite song outdoors and try to get others in your house to join in. You can sing your favourite song or if you're feeling creative you can create your own. Playing an instrument would be a lovely addition to the challenge.



Make a Nature Collage

You can link this to the 'Explore your garden' challenge. Collect interesting and odd things you find in the garden, once you have lots you can glue them to paper or cardboard. You could maybe create different animals with the objects and use additional supplies in the house to create your masterpiece.



Explore Your Garden

Channel your inner explorer. Look and see how many different insects, flowers and trees there are in your garden. Note down what you can see. If you find something that you are unsure about, research it. If you have them a magnifying glass or binoculars are a good way to add some more fun to your adventure.
