

Lesson 2: North Korea case study

Last term we had a quick look at what a dictatorship is. In a democracy, like the UK or the USA, people have a say in how their country is run. For example, Americans voted Joe Biden to be their President.

In a dictatorship, people do not have a say and sometimes have less rights than we do in the UK.

Today we are going to look at North Korea. North Korea is a dictatorship. Life there is very different to your life.



Lesson 4: Who Represents Us?

Over 5 million people live in Scotland. Over 66 million people live in the UK! This is far too many people to make decisions about what happens in our countries. Because of this, we vote for people to act for us in a certain area. This certain area is called a **constituency**. Our constituency is West Lothian. The person we vote for is called an MSP (Scotland) or MP (UK). They go to Parliament and vote for us.
